Project formation:

BP2 - everything went fine at both NIB and NAB. The supervisor allocation also seemed to be fine.

BA project - solo student were given a supervisor that they had not wished for. The number of solo projects have decreased, which have eased the allocation process.

The students have noticed that there is difference between how much time there is for the actual group formation at the different subject modules - at computer science they had 12 hours, whereas chemistry only had 6 hours. Martin explains that the coordinators has a lot of freedom in planning the project formation, which leads to different formats. Martin encourages students to give feedback to the coordinators.

BA kick-off:

The study leaders have decided to discontinue arranging the BA kick-off event. A survey for allocation purposes will be send out to the students instead.

Student representative in AR UDDU:

Maya has been appointed by the dean.

Change in practice regarding extended time for project work:

Punkt 14: Review of the disciplinary rules

The Department of Education and Students (the administration) has agreed with the Rector to initiate a revision process of the disciplinary rules at Roskilde University with broad involvement of stakeholders at the University. The revision has also been discussed with the associate deans.

Initially, the administration is calling for proposals for changes. These can be for specific provisions or more specific areas. As inspiration for the revision, the administration will also obtain similar sets of rules from other universities.

The administration will then draft a proposal for a new set of rules, which will be sent for consultation in the study boards and the Academic Council before the Rector hopefully approves the new set of rules before the summer holidays. The idea is that the new rules will come into force at the start of the semester on September 1, 2025.

Process plan for revising the Rules on Disciplinary Measures, etc. for students at Roskilde University:

- End of January 2025: Associate Deans, Study Boards, and Study Leaders are informed about the process of revising the rules and encouraged to submit any proposals for changes to the administration.
- March 15, 2025: Deadline for submitting proposals for changes.
- May 2025: Proposal for revised rules is finalized by the administration.
- May 14, 2025: Draft of the rules is presented to the study leaders at a study leaders' meeting.
- June 2025: The rules are sent for consultation with study leaders, in study boards, and in the Academic Council (the Academic Council pre-treats the matter in the Education Committee).
- July 2025: The Rector approves the revised rules.
- July/August 2025: Students are informed, and the rules are posted on the intranet.
- September 1, 2025: The revised rules come into force.

Initially, the study boards are therefore requested to submit proposals for changes to the administration no later than March 15, 2025.

Beslutning

A board member asked how the disciplinary rules was invoked in cases where students participated in the Gaza demonstration. It was explained that as the demonstration was announced through proper channels and therefore not legal, the disciplinary rules was invoked.

The board notes, that it should be clarified that the bachelor study leaders does not make decision in cases for the subject module.

The study board members can sent in suggestions to the secretary and the secretary will submit the input before the deadline.

Punkt 15: Preliminary discussion of an adjustment of the bachelor programmes

See case presentation.

Beslutning

Martin frames the point. The university management have yet to decide on what the BA adjustment/reform is going to entail or on what scale, so there are still many unknowns in this process, which makes a discussion difficult.

The student representatives argued that the structure of the subject modules should be preserved and that interdisciplinarity is of great importance in the educations. It works well with starting having subject module courses at the third semester and having 3 subject module projects. Flexibility could be added by allowing students to choose themselves between BC4-8.

A board member argued that it is important the the different disciplines are taught separately as this makes most sense pedagogically and enhances learning outcome.

A board member argued that there could be more mandatory courses and with mandatory presence to ensure the students have access to a broad selection of subject modules and master educations. Another board member argues that this is not necessary as for example mathematics, differential equations is not relevant for computer science.

The board discusses BC1 and BC2 and sees benefits of having the courses in the same semester.

Mathematics at a basic level is a good idea and will provide more students with the opportunity of selecting the new modeling education. It is also argued that there is a need for raising the level at the basic level that the lecturers at the subject modules have commented on.

In terms of responsibility of the bachelor programme, quality assurance systems requires one study board to be responsible for the entire BA programme following the accreditation institution, even though the academic responsibility lies in the MA study board often.

The board discusses the opportunities for changing the ECTS number for the BA project and lowering the ECTS amount at the basic projects, so that the students starts out with smaller project as they start the education. It is also pointed out, that the students are really supported in the project process beside through their supervisor - at other institutes there are courses or workshops on how do project work. The student representatives state that supervisors have very different opinions on how a project should look like, there chances of being told something different in a course would therefore be high and thus not applicable. Additionally, the students argued that a whole course on how to do project work, would be too much.

Project work is a big part of why students are drawn to RUC, however, a project free semester could open up for new opportunities.

There is a need to review the ECTS load in different courses as this does not seem aligned to students.

HumBach suggestions for a BA reform: the board agrees with all the principles. A wish for the BA project to be bigger than the other projects.

Discussion should be continued at the next meeting. The next part will focus on the process.
